Other ideas?: It is important to have increased arts education in K-12 schools, however schools do not need the burden of another report card or grading system. I hesitate to support a Fine Arts Seal because it is an additional requirement for schools with (I assume) no additional funding to pay for someone to track graduating students' credits in Fine Arts. Perhaps community partners would be interested in sponsoring the arts program at schools in their community. Additionally, perhaps community service organizations, groups of retired teachers, and groups of retired artists may be interested in volunteering their time on a regular basis to provide a weekly art program for K-12 students. Because funding is so limited, we must consider "outside the box" ways to bring art back to the classroom. Ultimately the issue is that there is not enough revenue in the general fund to cover all that is important in our society.

Art has a positive effect on the community. It helps beautify the community, and it brings people together. Art bridges cultures and economic difference.
