- I support credit for student participation however for this type of course I feel A-F scoring is not productive as some students may not be artistic or skilled, however demonstrate great appreciation and are enriched by exposure to the arts. The first option I do not understand well. I believe if we are going to audit reporting about arts education perhaps it is to demonstrate when arts ed is combined with core classes such as math, science and literature how then it develops and improves the comprehension of core course work.

My interests have began at a young age taking ballet, tap and contemporary dance classes, as well as being instructed in needlepoint and other hand-made crafts. I was a performer with Phoenix Children's theater from 3rd - 12 grade. My father's involvement as a leader in COMPAS and Phoenix Zoo, inspired interest in the arts and sciences. (My father enlisted me to volunteer as a COMPAS auction as a bid scribe, when the auction took place live on TV, as I had good penmanship. I was hooked.) After college I continued my participation in community theater and my parents encouraged each of us to join organizations to support with our time and treasure, so we would not be "married" to our jobs. The expectation with first paychecks was to set aside savings and to donate back to the community. Thus I have been an active member of Phoenix Art Museum since 1986. PAMLeague Board of Directors and their events (Festival of Trees & Antique Market), Circles member and active with Phoenix Art Museum events such as pARTy and most notably in the last 7 years I have been the Designer Chairman for the Independent Woman Luncheon.

Arts/Cultural boards I have served on (or continue) and been member of fundraising /organizational committees include: Childsplay, COMPAS Jr, COMPAS, Chairman Greater Phoenix Greek Festival, Arizona Science Center Gala, Arizona Opera, Ballet Arizona Gala, Phoenix Public Library 100 year Gala, Dinner in the Stacks, Dinner in the Desert, Heard Museum Moon Dance, Phoenix Theatre, Actors Theater of Phoenix, Scottsdale Stagebrush Theatre.
